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**Minutes of Annual General Meeting at Club Premises 151 Burns Bay Road,
Lane Cove West on Sunday 24 September 2023. Commenced at 10.00 AM**

1. Attendance and apologies.

Present: Outgoing Board: Bevan Piper (BP) Chairman, Kevin Mulhall (KM) Deputy Chairman, John Lloyd (JL) Director, David Erskine (DE) Director and Andrew Gordon (AG) (Director).

External Auditor: Patryk August of Conroy Audit and Advisory

Management and members: Michelle Orec (MO) Secretary/Manager and 28 full members and 2 social members.

Apologies: Lindsay Sturman (LS) Treasurer, 9 Full Bowling Members (R Willis, M Mills, R Patterson, S Shortis, P Biddell, S Hobson, Monica Smith, M Brouggy & S Brouggy)

- 2. Departed members** since the last general meeting were given respect by members present with a minute's silence.
- 3. The Chairman advised** attending members that the meeting was being audio recorded.
- 4. Minutes of Extraordinary Meeting of 29 July 2023** were adopted (Proposed G Screen, seconded V Solway)
- 5. Minutes of previous Annual General Meeting** were adopted (proposed R. Moran, seconded V. Solway)
- 6. Annual Reports of previous Annual General Meeting** were adopted Financial Reports (proposed S Smith, seconded K Mulhall). Directors Report (proposed J Moran, seconded M Screen).
- 7. The Chairman** introduced Patryk August (PA), the club's auditor, to the meeting. PA addressed the meeting stating that he had signed off on a clean audit report. He congratulated the Club on increased sales revenue, advising that all income items went up except gaming. He further stated that the club was heavily reliant on volunteers, however, in terms of the record keeping and accounting side of things there would be a saving of \$60k-\$70k per year. He advised the Club was in a strong financial position despite recording a loss of 58K but adding back depreciation the result is line ball and a great result for the Club in difficult trading times and cost of living crisis.

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8. General Business

- 8.1. **Mal Knight (MK)** raised the anomaly of umpires and coaches not being mentioned in the minutes as was the case with last year's minutes.
- 8.2. **John Notley** (without notice) queried the increase of \$18k in other expenses. **PA**, from his notes, advised the increase was made up of electricity \$5k, Foxtel \$3k, raffle prizes \$5k, utility costs \$3 and computer expenses \$2k.
- 8.3. **Phillip Wade (PW)** stated "with our relationship with the AFL – it looks very encouraging – nobody seems to know anything about it!"

BP responded: "If you read the minutes of the meeting (*Note: Extra ordinary General Meeting 29 July 2023*) that very much encapsulates where we are at the moment."

PW replied: "So the MOU, which I thought was a very good MOU."

BP: "Sorry Phil, you've seen the MOU?"

PW: "Well you sent it out?"

BP: "No, we didn't. That's a private document. How did you see the MOU. It's not even signed. Phil where did you get the document from?"

PW: "You sent an email about it the other day."

BP: "No Phil. I did not." *The draft document was only circulated to board members in confidence in January 2023.* BP did not pursue the issue.

Graham Screen (GS): Commented, "Are you confident that you have covered all the issues which may be of importance to bowling members."

BP advised that all due diligence items has been thoroughly checked relative to the early status of negotiations.

GS: Suggested that members of the club be given the opportunity to raise any questions or concerns regarding the AFL with the board.

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Kevin Mulhall (KS): Stated that all matters pertaining to the AFL proposal were outlined at the meeting in July. Nothing has been agreed and any further queries should be put in writing to the new board.

Brian Paxton raised a query an establishment was going to be built at Blackman Park and assumed that the building was underway. **BP** informed him, supported by **John Notley**, that no such work has been undertaken. **PW**, in relation to points raised, stated that BP was “obviously in secret talks (*with the AFL*) and none of us are allowed to know.” **BP** took umbrage at this comment and **PW** duly apologised.

MK raised the issue of sponsorship of the AFL. BP advised that the board had not discussed this issue nor had discussions with the AFL.

BP concluded that the AFL matters had been comprehensively discussed at the July meeting and, in future, members will be progressively advised of anything contemplated with the AFL.

8.4 John Bowring (JB) said that “yesterday afternoon I was a bit ashamed of the Club. The reason was that Michelle was struggling at the bar with glasses stacking up etc.” He questioned “Why have we not got more bar staff when we are busy.”

MO responded by explaining the circumstances giving rise to yesterday’s busy period including hosting a birthday party of 20 people, 37 bowlers (all finishing at the same time) in addition to a large ad hoc group visiting the club.

BP undertook to liaise with MO to ensure adequate staffing is provided so that similar circumstances do not arise in future.

8.5 Graham Screen (GS) said, “I know for a fact that one of the group here have been approached not to come on a particular day because we have another group here, I think you can’t do that.”

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BP advised the meeting that **GS** was referring to the Tuesday Social Group at the time the Club was going to host the City Tattersall's Bowling Club. **MO** gave the group many weeks' notice to seek another day as the Club did not have the facilities nor space to accommodate the Group's various activities on the day of City Tattersall's visit. As the group were social members of the Club, they were welcome to attend the club at the time, however, would not be able to carry out their usual activities.

GS "you have to remember those 20 people that you're talking about who have to find some other day to come, where they only do Tuesdays, are social members of this club – are you going to tell all the others they can't come on Tuesdays ... let's get real here!"

BP "Graham, you also have to get real too! Our Secretary/Manager comes down specifically to attend to these ladies and she actually serves them in her own time." **GS** "She doesn't have to do that."

BP "She doesn't have to but she does – that's what the club is about."

GS "I am just lost in that argument. I can't understand it at all. You have a club – you want people to come here, you want them to be able to access ..."

BP "Graham, I will be quite frank with you – we want people to come here. When City Tatts come here, they are paying customers – they are going to help the Club. The ladies, at the moment, contribute nothing. We are happy to have them and we welcome them ... but ... when you have got those sorts of options for our future and the future of our bowlers, it is not even a consideration." **GS** "Look! I find that really objectionable."

8.6 Phillip Wade (PW) asked; "Can I ask our greens director if he has full backing of the Board and any suggestions he would like to make including the deteriorating state of the greens."

John Lloyd (JL) responded; "I believe the Board does back me 100% - I have been given an imprimatur to approach the guys who do our greens about the cost of redoing a full green which is upwards of \$85k but once again that cost -

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the only way we could afford it would be to get a grant – a grant Bevan would take two plus years? (BP advised it would probably take 8-9 months).

BP “The Board has had this on the agenda and has asked John to do that – we are quite aware of the situation and the only way we can see coping with that situation is to get a grant to redo the green. But that would be very expensive and would mean the green would be out for a long time. We would only have one green and a whole range of situations that would come up. The total thing might cost us \$85-90K, however, if we get a grant we would be up for half of that cost.” “So, there is a lot to be taken into consideration.” “Do we just want to have one green for a year?”

PW “I believe there is an alternative given our bowlers are going to other clubs just to have a roll-up just to be able to compete in state events.” **BP** “I can’t answer that – what is the alternative?”

PW “I suggest you go back to our green’s director.”

JL did not present an alternative, however, outlined the present rotation programme for the two greens stating that “hopefully they should be right for the Pennant season.”

PW “Can I also suggest the green’s director be allowed to have regular talks particularly to members of the men’s bowling committee about that whole question.”

BP “He goes to all of their monthly management meetings – why create another layer of meetings?”

8.7 Sign: Mal Knight (ML) questioned, “Bevan, if yourself and others don’t stand for the Board there will be no one left who was involved with the instalment of the sign out the front - has there been any progress?”

BP responded that, regrettably, due to lack of resources he had not been able to give the matter the attention it deserved being such a valuable item to “sit up there doing nothing.” He advised that it had Board priority and actions had commenced to bring the matter to a successful conclusion in the shortest time possible.

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- 8.8 Bottom Green (Green 2):** In response to a question from **Kelly Mason, BP** advised that the green was hired out to community and sporting groups. **Jenny Moran** suggested installing tables and chairs on the green which would encourage patronage from a younger group with young children. **BP** thanked Jenny for her suggestion and indicated it could be funded by a small grant or sponsorship.
- 8.9 Umbrellas:** **Judy Carroll** advised that some time ago a sponsor provided the Club with umbrellas, “all of which have disappeared.” **MO** said that they were not in good condition and had been disposed of in a cleanup as they were not needed. **David Madson (DM)** said that “when we did the awning it took away the need for umbrellas out there and they were very cumbersome, took up a lot of room, offered to members and nobody wanted to take them.” **John Lloyd (JL)** mentioned “... a couple of people who are doing volunteer work for the Club and doing a great job for us. Firstly, **Graham** and **Marilyn** for your help on Tuesdays-**Judy** as well, for your efforts and probably last but not least **Sarah Hobson**, the President, for her efforts most Friday nights but the people who fill-in doing the raffle on Friday nights and, of course, **David Erskine** for his efforts with the raffles.”
- BP** invited **David** to address the meeting and he said, “So far this year we have taken in \$14,500 since 1 January 2023 and our profit is \$5,445 and so far this month, we are \$854 in profit and next Friday we hope that will be \$1,000 in one month.” A wonderful effort on David’s part.
- Greg Moon** congratulated **BP** for the Club’s newsletter. **BP** thanked **Greg**.
- 9. Merit Awards** were presented to **Ray Moran** and **Lindsay Sturman**. **BP** addressed the meeting advising, “Merit Awards were introduced in 2009, having a lot to do with **Bob Willis**, in recognition of those members who demonstrated exceptional dedication, leadership and contributions as administrators and volunteers within the Club. Recipients of the Awards have demonstrated commitment to the Club and sport through their roles and made a significant impact to the Club’s success and growth.”

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“This year we have two exceptional members who have created and initiated programmes that have had a marked effect on the success of the Club financially, whilst promoting the participation and volunteerism among Club members as well as the Club’s involvement in community services.”

“Both these men demonstrated commitment to the long-term sustainability of the Club, they seek no accolades and nothing was too demanding of them – they just got on with the job!”

“**Lindsay Sturman** joined the Club in April 2017, joining the Board in 2018 where he served 4 terms as Treasurer and one term as director. He has been a great clubman and exceptional Treasurer. Among his many achievements was drafting our marketing plan, review and update of our constitution and bylaws as well as reviewing grant opportunities. He also demonstrated exceptional knowledge of government regulations as required for club governance.”

“**Ray Moran**, our Mr Fix-it, with 9 years of membership since joining in July 2014. Ray served 6 terms on the Board – Deputy Chairman for 1 term, Treasurer for 2 terms and a director for 3 terms. He has proved to be an all-round great clubman; nothing was ever too difficult for him to turn his hand to. Ray has served with distinction over many years on the House and Gaming Committees and was the go-to man for putting together our grant applications.”

“Well done to both of these fine men – your selfless contributions will endure.”

10. Election of Office Bearers

BP advised that “only two nominations were received for Board positions namely **David Erskine** and **John Lloyd** and, of course, being the only nominations are duly elected – the remaining positions, namely, Chairman, Deputy Chairman, Treasurer and two directors can be elected from the floor today.”

BP advised the meeting of the legal ramifications and processes required to elect the remaining members of the Board. He explained that the Club could carry on with a quorum of four directors until a general meeting is called to elect the other members.

BP then called for nominations for two director positions and these positions were filled from the floor, namely;

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David Madson (Proposed Greg Moon) (Seconded John Notley)

Ray Moran (Proposed Jenny Moran) (Seconded Judy Carroll)

BP then called nominations for Chairman

There were numerous requests from the floor for Bevan to stand for Chairman

Stuart Smith (SS) commented that there was a “Big movement from the floor Bevan for you to be Chairman. I know it’s been a difficult year for you but at the end of the day I think everybody in this club has a great deal of confidence in the job that you have been doing and the job that you continue to do as Chairman.”

BP addressed the meeting saying “if he had the confidence and overwhelming majority support of this room I would consider standing.”

A show of hands of eligible members voted overwhelming for Bevan as Chairman, with only 3 dissenting votes. Bevan respectfully accepted the nomination and thanked the meeting for their support and confidence.

Bevan was duly elected **Chairman**.

Bevan Piper (Proposed Judy Carroll Seconded Vic Solway)

BP proposed and **KM** seconded the nomination of **John Burke** for Deputy Chair and John duly accepted and was elected. After some debate there were no nominations for Treasurer. **David Madson (DM)** recommended that “the position be taken off-line by the Board as we may have to go to an external accountant rather than doing it in-house”. DM’s recommendation was carried by the meeting and the Treasurer position became a casual vacancy.

KM read out the elected positions, namely-

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John Notley then added, "I would like to say just how much we appreciated what the Board has done for the last year, it has been a very, very difficult for them as have the last two years and I would like to record our appreciation of the Board and those who stood for the Board for the last year."

BP, on behalf of the Board, thanked John for his kind words.

BP thanked the attendees for their contributions and attendance.

11. Close: The meeting closed at 11.35 am.

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CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

JOHN BURKE

Our Club has shown its ability to Change, Adapt and Succeed this year.

Our Club succeeded in delivering its first State Championship team victory and was runner-up in the Grade 5 Pennant season. We also provided solid representation in all District events. Our competitors are now wondering, "what's in the water at Lane Cove?"

The 2023-2024 year has also seen a year of change.

Our experienced Chairman Bevan Piper stood down and handed down a strong base to build upon. Ray Moran, a long-serving Board member, stood down as Treasurer and we welcomed Stephen Brouggy as his replacement. Stephen has embraced the role and is making it his own. Will Godfrey was appointed to the vacant Board position and his contribution has been significant. Will has provided introductions to Lane Cove Council management and has been instrumental in our sponsorship signage approval. Will is currently securing much needed sponsorships. Our Secretary Manager of 10 years Michelle Orec departed, and Janina Sugano was promoted to the role. We are excited by Janina's vibrancy, embracing of technology and a focus on our members. Janina has supported and facilitated our Club's membership growth, which currently stands at over 460 members (over 100% growth for the year).

Our Club's financial performance has been ahead of expectations, despite a difficult macro-economic environment. We have been able to reverse a two year decline in the "Cash and Cash Equivalents" balance and we have finished the year in a strong financial position.

We see the future of the Club's success in our ability to:

- Maintain our unique community feel
- Perform on the bowling greens
- Attract new members
- Attract sponsorship

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On behalf of the Board, I thank all our Members. We are the envy of many!

Special thanks to all Committee Members, staff and volunteers who give their time. It is not by accident that we have such a great culture.

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TREASURER'S REPORT

STEPHEN BROUGGY

The attached Financial Report provides a complete review of the Financial Statement and Balance Sheet and detailed results for the financial year 2023-24 compared with 2022-23. The reports are prepared by the club's accountants Conroy Audit & Advisory from our accounts.

The Club results for the financial year ended 30 June 2024 was a loss of \$34,493 (2022-2023 \$58,100 loss).

Revenue from ordinary activities increased by \$108,674 over last year, primarily from increased bar sales \$72,715 and green fees \$14,293. Poker machine income was in line with the prior year, but this year's expectation will be lower. Interest earned and catering income also contributed to the revenue increase.

Bar trading profit for the year was \$294,712 (60%) as against 2023 of \$237,100 (57%).

Our earnings for the year, before depreciation and amortisation expense, was a profit of \$18,458 (2022-23 \$1,434 loss) after allowing for provision for an ex-employee backpay negotiation of \$32,850. Please refer to Note 11: Provisions. Depreciation and amortisation expense for the year (\$52,951) against 2022-2023 (\$56,666) resulted in a loss of (\$34,493). Prior year was (\$58,100) loss.

Capital expenditure for the year of \$26,382 included major additions of 2 Helix Dragon Cash Machines \$4,000 each, POS System \$4,023, Plith Boards to the perimeter of Green 3 \$3,803 and the replacement of the Evaporator \$3,480. Member's Funds total \$577,155 (2023 \$611,648) and included cash and cash equivalents of \$474,353 (2023 \$455,393).

In 2024-25 we anticipate a continuation of the strong returns from hospitality, hall hire and bowling activities. Gaming machine returns are expected to diminish significantly. The Club is actively seeking sponsorship along with continued expenditure control.
